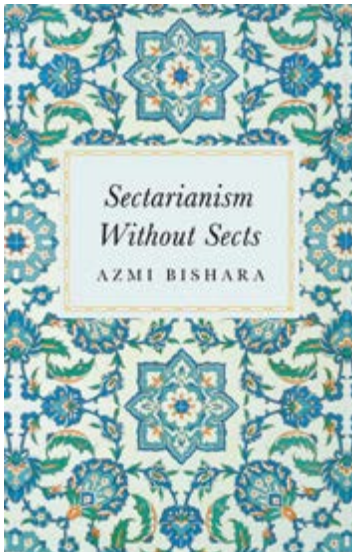
Seeking Stability Amidst Disorder
